When Is Bullying Really Bullying?

Bullying is often an umbrella term used to group together a range of sins or misdemeanors. The sad reality is that many things that society consider bullying are, in fact, not bullying at all.

This is not to undermine the fact that people make mistakes. They sin, they are unkind and hurtful. They look to their own interests and consider the interests of others as less important. These are facts that we, as educators, work with your children on, on a daily basis. The brokenness of the world in which we live has people considering options that hurt, rather than help.

Being unkind is not bullying. Saying something hurtful is not bullying. Excluding someone from a game is not bullying. These are all things that from time to time, we have all been guilty of. Bullying is a repeated, ongoing, targeted attack on an individual. It is not our brokenness, our sinfulness and our hurtfulness. These things can escalate into bullying, which is why we seek to address individual choices and responses in a timely and appropriate manner. At St Peter's we have a zero tolerance approach to bullying.

Bullying cannot and should not be the term that we use to blanket all of the misdemeanors our students engage in. We need to call a spade a spade. We need to acknowledge unkindness, hurtfulness and cruelty as they are, and address and stop them before they become bullying.

Our focus in Buddy Groups this term is building resilience and understanding what to do when dealing with others. Building positive relationships certainly helps, as does being part of a Community.

Our staff are also hands on in their approach in combatting this and encouraging our children to act as God would have us act toward one another. We work to restore relationships and heal what is broken. One step at a time, in partnership, before it becomes bullying.

Today has been declared by the Prime Minister a National Day of Action Against Bullying.

If you feel bullying is occurring, please speak up. Likewise, if you feel someone is being unkind, please let us know.

Next week, our students will be considering the end of the phrase Jesus is _____. A mission running across the Wollongong Diocese of the Anglican Church in schools, churches and other areas, the mission considers what people consider about Jesus, encouraging conversation and connection.

As a Christian school, I was delighted to accept the Bishop's invitation to be part of this mission. As such, students from Moore Theological College, will be working with our Chaplaincy/ Ministry Staff throughout this week to allow students the opportunity to consider who Jesus is.

The Office of the Children's Guardian will email holders three (3) months prior to their expiry date and will explain what you need to do. Renewals cannot be processed until you receive your email alert.

Once you have renewed your Working with Children's Check number, could you please advise the School Office.

International Competitions and Assessment for School (ICAS) 2018

Students in Years 3 to 6

The ICAS Assessments are an external opportunity to assess a student's ability beyond expected grade level knowledge and skills. They are formulated using both Australian and International Curriculum Documents and are classified as a highly academic and rigorous testing platform, where content assessed excels 2 grade levels beyond that of the participating student.

The ICAS assessments will be conducted on the following days:

Science - Tuesday, 29 May (Term 2, Week 5)

English - Tuesday, 31 July (Term 3, Week 1)

Mathematics - Tuesday, 14 August (Term 3, Week 3)

Students who are members of the Literacy Extension classes will be automatically enrolled in the English competition. Students who are members of the top Mathematics classes will be automatically enrolled in the Mathematics competition. Participation in the Science competition is an open invitation.

Students within parallel classes are welcome to participate; however, a conversation with the Classroom Teacher and / or Team Leader is highly recommended, to ensure these assessments are appropriate for each individual student.

Notes were sent home to all students in Years 3 to 6. Parents wishing to enrol their child in a competition that they are not already automatically enrolled in, are required to complete the permission note and return it no later than:

Friday, 16 March (Week 7).

With that being said, many of our students, some competing for the first time at an IPSHA Carnival, performed personal best times and received ribbons for a top 4 finish in their heats. Some notable performances were Amie B who placed 15th in the 12 year old girls 50m butterfly and Jaxson S who qualified for CIS in two events, finishing 3rd in the 11 years' backstroke and 5th in the 50m freestyle.

This is a truly amazing achievement and the best performance of a St Peter's student in my 4 years of attending IPSHA swimming.



Community Fundraiser for Intumbane

Launch Date – Week 8 – 19 March 2018

St Peter's is participating in the "Return and Earn Program" where drink containers are eligible for a 10-cent refund.

Students are encouraged to collect and bring **plastic bottles and aluminum cans** to School. Containers should be empty, uncrushed and have the original label attached.

We ask that no glass or any containers advertising alcoholic beverages are brought into the School. Cordial and plain milk containers of one litre or more are generally not eligible.

Containers that St Peter's will be including in the Scheme include:

- Most 150 ml to three litre drink containers
- Aluminum
- Plastic ie water bottles
- Liquid paperboard (cartons) i.e. poppers



Two large yellow bins will be placed in the entry of the tunnel. Students are encouraged to bring their containers and place them in the bins each morning.

This is a great initiative for the St Peter's students and community to participate in to help the environment. Funds raised will be forwarded to Intumbane Primary School for student resources.
